

## The Stockyards, Arizona's Original Steakhouse Kicks Off Arizona's Centennial Celebration



In 1919, Edward A. Tovrea, opened the Tovrea Stockyards, the world's largest pen feeding operation and became one of the West's foremost cattle producers earning him the Cattle Baron nickname. Located on 175 acres along historic Washington Street, the yard accommodated 300,000 head of cattle every year and featured more than eight miles of feed trough. Cattle passing through the Stockyards came and went to all parts of the United States. In 1947, The Stockyards, Arizona's Original Steakhouse, opened at the center of the yard and quickly became a place where history was made and business was done.

More than 63 years later, The Stockyards remains true to its heritage, featuring only the finest corn-fed, aged Steaks and Prime Rib. With an emphasis on hearty flavors, The Stockyards' New West cuisine embraces the culture and culinary trends of the Southwest, utilizing the freshest and highest quality indigenous ingredients in new and innovative ways.

As a historic landmark for Arizona, The Stockyards has partnered with Arizona's official Centennial Commission to celebrate Arizona's 100th birthday in 2012. As a part of the celebration, The Stockyards created Centennial Taste of Arizona, the official menu of Arizona's centennial. Citizens from across the state are invited to submit recipes from a favorite Arizona restaurant or from grandmother's kitchen for a chance to be a part of the official menu. The Centennial Taste of Arizona will serve as a lasting legacy for future generations to add to and enjoy.

"As Arizona's Original Steakhouse, The Stockyards is an important part of Arizona history," said Gary Lasko, Proprietor of The Stockyards. "We are honored to celebrate the centennial alongside the commission and hope





Arizonans from across the state contribute their all-time favorite Arizona recipes for a chance to be a part of the official Centennial Menu."



The Stockyards is also hosting a series of events that recognize and thank deserving Arizonans for their impact on the history and future of the state. Each event will be themed according to the honoree's impact on Arizona. To commemorate the honoree's Arizona legacy, The Stockyards will dedicate a booth in their name.

The first of these events marked the beginning of the official centennial celebration for our state. The Stockyards and the Centennial Commission honored E.A. Tovrea for his role as

one of the 52 delegates that attended the Arizona Constitutional Convention in 1910.

The Stockyards serves lunch from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and dinner nightly beginning at 5:00 p.m. Signature dishes include; Buffalo Meatloaf with pan whipped potatoes; Skillet Salmon with citrus chile glaze; Paloma Ranch Calf Fries with cocktail sauce; "Best of the West" Prime Rib; Stockyards Steaks (20 oz Porterhouse, 12 oz New York Strip, 20 oz Buffalo Ribeye, 12 oz Top Sirloin Baseball Cut, 12 oz Filet Mignon/ 8 oz Filet Mignon) and the Strawberry Shortcake with whipped cream for dessert.
